The active tropical season continues as a couple of systems look to impact Mexico early this week. Hurricane Willa is poised to make landfall near the border of Nayarit and Sinaloa by Tuesday afternoon as a major Category 3 Hurricane.

Strong winds along with 6-12 inches of rain are forecast through Wednesday with lesser amounts to the north. To the south of Willa Tropical

Storm Vicente moves into Southern Jalisco late Tuesday with up to 10 inches of rain along the western coast of Jalisco.

This one-two punch across Central Mexico will likely cause damage to shade houses and hoops used throughout the region due to strong winds. Heavy rains will have the potential for flash flooding and infrastructure damage. The remnants of these two systems should be exiting the area into the weekend. Many crops look to be in the path of these systems from berries to bell peppers, beans, melons, squash, and corn.

We will be watching these powerful systems as they move into Central Mexico and keep you up to date on potential crop damage and disruptions as we gather more information.
